PRESCHOOL FEES FOR 2024

The Government has finally released our funding allocations for 2024. The committee is now finalising the preschool budget and fees and next week families should receive an email regarding the fee structures.

The NSW Government is providing fee relief to families through the Start Strong for Community Preschools program. Families can only apply for fee relief from one service.

If your child will be attending another service that offers fee relief (another community preschool or a long day care service), you will need to choose which service you would like to receive fee relief from.

Families will need to complete a **declaration form** from the NSW Department of Education so that we know whether our service should apply fee relief to your child's invoices. We will provide you with a copy of this form with the fee information.



IT'S NOT CALLED THE SILLY SEASON FOR NOTHING!

Christmas is a great time for children to enjoy family and friends. But it can also be a time when they learn some dangerous lessons that could make them more vulnerable to abusers. Let's take a look at some of these lessons we are teaching our kids and make sure we don't get caught in some of these common traps.

Santa is a Stranger

What have we been thinking all this time?!!! We sit our children on a strange man's lap - he's dressed in a ridiculous red suit, has a weird long white beard and facial hair, and talks in a spooky low voice saying "Ho ho ho" all the time. Then - when our children's perfectly good instincts tell them this could be dangerous, they scream and cry with fear. But instead of validating this fear and nurturing the very instincts that could one day save them from a predator - we encourage, beg and plead with them to stay on the man's lap on their own while parents step away to have the photo taken!! Then we cap it all off by saying, "Smile!!" If very young children are scared of Santa then there's no need to push them to interact with him. If you're desperate for a photo then hold your child while you're standing beside Santa - but if even this is too scary - then the most sensible thing to do is photo shop him in later! Let children learn the lesson that when they let a parent know they're scared, then they will be protected and will feel safe again. This is the very beginning of teaching children to listen to their instincts and feelings and then making good choices to feel safe.

If children are a little older you can talk with them about how they're feeling. Make sure you validate their fear so they learn to listen to their instincts instead of ignoring them. You could say, "I can see you're feeling scared and frightened. That's okay – Santa looks scary and he's a person we don't know." Then you can discuss how the Santa at the shop isn't real, and it's just a bit of fun at Christmas, and then ask them whether they'd like to have a photo or not – but reassure them that they have the choice. You should also let them know that you'll stay with them and watch them the whole time while they are there and anytime they want to leave they are free to do so. Make sure you talk to them later about how they listened to their feelings and told someone about feeling scared and now they feel safe – so they learn that trusting their feelings and talking to people about them is good.

A Less Stranger Kind of Danger

Christmas is a great time to catch up with those friends and relatives we only see once a year. But sometimes there's a reason we don't see these people more often! And sometimes we see friends and relatives more often but we wish we only saw them once a year! But if you think it's hard dealing with this as an adult - try being a kid!

Remember when children are greeting or saying goodbye to friends and relatives - let them decide how they'd like to do that. Don't trample all over children's instincts by forcing them to kiss furry Aunt Thelma, or hug smelly Uncle Dave. Children have a right to make choices and a right to feel safe. If they don't feel comfortable with kissing or hugging others, don't push them to do it.

Make sure you stop yourself before you say things like, "Don't be rude - give your Aunty a kiss" or "Uncle Dave loves you - he bought you that lovely gift - now you go and give him a hug goodbye". Don't let other relatives do this either - interrupt them and explain that you don't expect your children to be forced to do things that make them feel unsafe.

If children are scared or apprehensive, validate that feeling and let them know it's okay to be a little worried about people sometimes – and then encourage them to make a choice to feel safe. They may choose to do a high five instead of a hug or kiss, or just a friendly smile and wave if they don't want to get even that close.

It's important to remember that when it comes to child abuse, statistics tell us that friends and family are more likely to be offenders than strangers – so don't drop your guard and don't squash your child's instincts even around family and friends.

THE KIDS ALIVE DO THE FIVE APP

With summer now upon us, now is a great opportunity to reinforce water safety messages with your child/ ren.

The Kids Alive Do The Five App has been de-

signed to teach young children and parents about water safety. Users can explore a range of water safety education materials to enjoy with young children. This App will work on iPad and iPhone.

Drowning is a leading cause of accidental death in children under five in Australia. This trend is similar world wide. The emotional impact on families from such a tragedy lasts a lifetime. Backyard swimming pools pose the greatest danger.

In 1988, Laurie Lawrence created the Kids Alive Do the Five water safety program. Since then drownings in the under 5 age group have reduced however they are working towards zero preschool drownings.

The Kids Alive community service program pushes the mantra of, fence the pool, shut the gate, teach your kids to swim - it's great, supervise - watch your mate and learn how to resuscitate. Kids Alive - Do The Five.

CHECK POOL GATE MONTH

Kids Alive is proud to be a partner of the annual <u>'Check Pool Gate Month'</u>, championing pool gate safety and urging the community to prioritise this essential aspect of water safety.

Ensuring Backyard Pool Safety

Research from The MagnaLatch® Pool Safety Report, conducted for 'Check-Your-Pool-Gate Month,' reveals a concerning trend: over half (55%) of pool owners prop open the gate when kids are in pool or while having a party. Shockingly, a significant portion of families (30%) have experienced a pool-related injury and emergencies.

The report also revealed that one in five families found a child gaining unsupervised access to their pool. It also showed supervision is lacking with 50% of parents admitting to leaving the kids in the pool while they completed a quick chore. Leaving a child unsupervised significantly increases the risk of accidents. Supervision is a drowning prevention method that no one can overlook!

BUTTON BATTERIES
